- To increase awareness among adolescent girls on Menstrual Hygiene.
- To increase access to and use of high quality sanitary napkins to adolescent girls in rural areas.
- To ensure safe disposal of Sanitary Napkins in an environmentally friendly manner.
- To provide menstrual hygiene awareness for rural females of menstrual age.

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REPORT:

In many rural communities, menstrual hygiene remains a topic shrouded in secrecy and shame. Cultural beliefs and misconceptions contribute to the marginalization of Young Girls during their periods, leading to discrimination, exclusion, and limited access to essential resources. Our students organized these activities in breaking down these barriers and providing the necessary support for girls to manage their menstrual health effectively. With this regards Rotary Club GadagBetgeri organized an Awareness Programme on "Importance of menstrual hygiene" at Government High School (RMSA) Hatalageri on 23-12-2023.


